Homework

We hope that parents will want to be involved in their children's learning. We would love to see any follow up and related work completed at home. You can share this by taking photos and posting it on Seesaw.

Regular reading is very important. At the moment we are completing phonics assessments in school. As soon as these are completed your child will bring home a book related to their phonics level.

We would recommend daily sessions of approximately 10 minutes, with regular discussion about the book with an adult. Please fill in your child's reading record after you have read with them.

Maths homework will consist of 30 minutes Mathswhizz on Tutor Mode per week. This can be done in short bursts. Please let us know if you cannot access the internet at home.

Clothing Requirements / P.E and Games

Children should attend school in their PE kits on the days their class has PE. This should include a pair of sensible shoes that are suitable for sporting activities. Your child does not need a change of clothes and will stay in their P.E. kit throughout the day. Their P.E. kit should be suitable for outdoor weather e.g. tracksuits, jogging bottoms, sweaters. A lightweight waterproof jacket is also recommended on these days in case of rain.

We would like to remind parents that jewellery must not be worn in school at any time.

Please make sure long hair is tied back for P.E. lessons.

Y1DH PE lessons take place on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. Y1PL PE lessons take place on Tuesdays and Wednesdays.

Lost Property

We always seem to have an increasing amount of lost property. Everyone can help by labelling all children's clothes, including sweatshirts worn on P.E days and water bottles and lunch boxes so that they can be returned. In particular please make sure jumpers and cardigans are labelled.

Lost property is kept in our year group cloakroom.

Parent/Teacher meetings

As you may know, at Bradway we believe that good communication with parents is crucial if pupils are to achieve their potential at school.

We will be using Seesaw to communicate important year group specific messages. As adults are not allowed into the school building, you can use Seesaw to communicate any important information to us.

A written annual report on your child's progress will be sent to you in July.

Reminders

- Only water should be put in water bottles for use in the classroom
- Mid-morning snacks should be fruit or vegetables. Please note other snacks are no longer permitted

A pupil in Y1H has an allergy to nuts including all foods that may contain nuts and nut-trace products. Touching or eating these items may provoke an allergic reaction. For the safety of this pupil, we are asking parents not to send any food containing nuts to school. There are two pupils in Y!PL who have allergies. One child has a severe, life-threatening allergy to milk, dairy and another to nuts. Touching or eating these items may provoke a severe allergic reaction. For the safety of the pupils we are asking parents not to send any food containing these items to school as a snack. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.
