Topic Work

Homework

- **Reading:** regular reading is very important. We would recommend 10 - 15 minute sessions at least three times a week. Year 3 will shortly be using new reading software called 'Accelerated Reader' (those parents with children in years 4-6 will know this system). Children will be encouraged to take regular quizzes on the Accelerated Reader programme to test their comprehension of the texts they have read. Over the next few weeks, children will be tested and provided with a school reading book. They can quiz either at school or at home using the Accelerated Reader website. **Reading with an adult is vitally important as discussion of the texts will not only help develop children's reading comprehension skills, but provide them with ideas for their own writing**
- **Times Tables:** learning these off by heart is essential as there will be a weekly Times Table test and year 3 pupils will be working towards a national test at the end of the year 4. There are various Apps available for phone/Ipad/Tablet that can help make this fun and interactive.
- **Spellings:** children are required to learn new spellings every week. They will be given on a Tuesday and tested the following Tuesday. Children will have a week to practice the words using a website/app called Spelling Shed (further details will be provided and sent home with the child).
- **Maths Whizz:** a minimum of 30 min per week on Maths Whizz (if your child is unable to access this during the week, please let us know). It is suggested that this is completed in 2/3 sessions of 15 min.

P.E

If your child is unable to take part in a P.E lesson, a note from home is required. For P.E. lessons, children must come to school in suitable clothing for outdoor P.E.

All these items should be clearly named

Long hair should be tied back. **Earrings and other jewellery must not be worn for P.E.**, in line with the school uniform policy. PE lessons will take place on **Tuesdays** and **Wednesdays** in both classes. Until further notice children are asked to arrive in their PE kits on Tuesdays and Wednesdays.

Arrival and Departure Each Day

This year, Y3 children should be in school by 8.50am and should wait on the grass to left of the main gate. There they will be greeted by a member of the year 3 team and enter school through the Y3 external door. **For safeguarding reasons, parents should leave the school site as soon as they have dropped off their child.** At the end of the day, children can be collected from the same place they were dropped off as above.
